POSITIVE SENTENCE

IN THE PRESENT TENSE

SUBJECT



VERB



OBJECT

I HAVE A SURFBOARD

YOU EAT AN APPLE

HE LOVES CHOCOLATE

Remember, you have to add an 's' at the end of the verb for he/she/it.

NEGATIVE SENTENCE

IN THE PRESENT TENSE

SUBJECT



DO NOT / DOES NOT



VERB



OBJECT

I DO NOT HAVE A SURFBOARD

YOU DO NOT EAT AN APPLE

HE DOES NOT LOVE CHOCOLATE

For a negative sentence, 'do' changes to 'does' for he/she/it, but the other verb goes back to normal



EXCEPTIONS WITH NEGATIVE SENTENCES



THE VERB:
CAN

CAN

CANNOT / CAN'T

+ verb

THE VERB:
TO BE

AM / IS /
ARE

AM / IS / ARE NOT

+ adjective,
noun or verb
(with -ing)

EXAMPLES

I can't swim

You are not happy

They can't speak Chinese

He is not a teacher
