### To Like

- To like something means you enjoy it or it gives you some form of pleasure.
- You can like something a little bit or a lot.
- When you want to say you like something you can say many different things but usually you can just say, "I like \_\_\_\_\_"
- Examples:
  - I like my house
  - I like to go shopping
  - I like being clean
  - I like dogs
- When using to like for different pronouns (you, he, she, it, we, them) then you can say, "(Pronoun) like(s) \_\_\_\_\_
- Examples:
  - You like cats
  - She/He/It likes cats
  - We like cats
  - They like cats
- The main difference is that for the pronouns I, you, we, and them it is like and for he, she, and it, it is likes with an s

#### To Love

- When you love something it usually means that you like it very much.
- When you want to say you love something you can say many different things but usually you can just say, "I love \_\_\_\_\_"
- Examples:
  - I love my house
  - I love my parents
  - I love being clean
  - I love my friends
- When using to love for different pronouns (you, he, she, it, we, them) then you can say, "(Pronoun) love(s)
- Examples:
  - You love cats
  - She/He/It loves cats
  - We love cats
  - They love cats
- The main difference is that for the pronouns I, you, we, and them it is "love" and for he, she, and it, it is "loves" with an "s"

#### To Dislike

- To dislike something means you do not enjoy it or it gives you some form of pain.
- You can dislike something a little bit or a lot.
- When you want to say you dislike something you can say many different things but usually you can just say, "I dislike \_\_\_\_\_"
  or "I do not like \_\_\_\_\_"
- Examples:
  - I dislike when my brother is annoying.
  - I do not like going shopping
  - I don't like watching sports
- When using to dislike for different pronouns (you, he, she, it, we, them) then you can say, "(Pronoun) dislike(s) \_\_\_\_\_" or " (Pronoun) do(es) not like \_\_\_\_\_"
- Examples:
  - You dislike cats
  - "She/He/It does not like cats"
  - We don't like cats
  - They dislike cats
- The main difference is that for the pronouns I, you, we, and them it is "do not like" and for he, she, and it, it is "does not like".

#### To Hate

- When you hate something it means that you dislike it very much.
- When you want to say you hate something you can say many different things but usually you can just say, "I hate \_\_\_\_\_"
- Examples:
  - I hate going shopping
  - I hate watching sports
  - I hate traffic
- When using to hate for different pronouns (you, he, she, it, we, them) then you can say, "(Pronoun) hate(s) \_\_\_\_\_
- Examples:
  - You hate shopping
  - She/He/It hates shopping
  - We hate shopping
  - They hate shopping
- The main difference is that for the pronouns I, you, we, and them it is "hate" and for he, she, and it, it is "hates" with an "s"
