Introduction

- It is good to know the weather and temperature in any language you are trying to know.
- This is so because it is a very common topic for small talk.
- Small talk is a primary way for learning how to communicate in a new language, it opens the doors to new friendships with those who speak your desired language.
- So if you know the weather and temperature, and you know them well, then it will act as a door opener to further improvement in your English learning process.
- In this unit you will learn how to speak about the weather and temperature by learning the necessary vocabulary and the facts every English native knows about these two things.

Temperature


- The temperature is the amount of degrees it is outside wherever you are.
- The degrees of temperature are usually counted in degrees celsius, but in the United States they are counted in Fahrenheit.
- Boiling point is the temperature where water begins to boil.
- Freezing point is the temperature where water starts to freeze.
- The boiling point and freezing point are different in Celsius and Fahrenheit
- Celsius:
 - \circ Freezing point = 100 $^{\circ}$
 - \circ Boiling point = 0°
- Fahrenheit
 - \circ Freezing Point = 32°
 - Boiling Point = 212°
- Useful phrases for talking about temperature:
 - "It's really" + "hot or cold" "out today."
 - "Do you know the temperature?"
 - "It looks like it will be ___ degrees out tomorrow."

Weather

- The weather is the condition of the forces of nature outside in your area.
- You could live in an area with very consistent and stable weather, or you could live somewhere where the weather always changes.
- There are many types of weather, some types of weather are very specific to certain parts of the world.
- Some examples:
 - Monsoons
 - Tornados
 - Hurricanes
 - Typhoons
- Although these are good to know the next page presents more general weather conditions that are the most common.
- Useful phrases for talking about the weather:
 - "How's the weather?"
 - "Nice weather we're having, isn't it?"
 - "It looks like it will start raining tomorrow"


